Access class: informal intervention time in bedded into class schedule and structure; Almost 400 individuals responded to inquiry into this program; Mandatory studying in middle school will probably be taken away, will be offered as elective; About 40 minutes, not full 90 minutes; This will start next fall.

State sponsored; Center set up after the school shooting May 7, 2019; Grant extended to December 2023

Clinical services, art, activities, yoga, meditation, peer to peer book clubs (current book for staff, community, and parents – "the body keeps the score"), Dungeons and dragons, Fidget keychains,

All services are free: with clinical services are available to those directly impacted by the events on May 7^{th} , 2019

School is hosting resilience fair, Tuesday dec 13 from 6-8, enter through the elementary school, giving center and community resources for resilience

Spoke about pushing mill bond, spoke about teacher of year who is Rocio Meli of Castle Rock, spoke about the UIP plan posted on school view, Ashley Summers from douglas county foundation attended the DAC (our PTO uses this foundation)-> the Douglas county foundation will support booster clubs, all of this foundation funding comes from donations, they exist to help PTO and booster clubs; the DAC is talking about going to block scheduling (90 minute classes with Friday being the 40 minute full day classes, with some parents unhappy about this change; the PATHWAYS program is slowly centralizing to the legacy campus (how with they move the students to and from legacy centers from highschools?); CE courses are

encouraged, encourage your students to use the money available to them on this program; winter forum will happen at legacy focusing more on CTE tech programs, \bigcirc PTO

Have a fall grant cycle and spring grant cycle for teacher support, PTO grants 14900 for this fall grant cycle; the fundraising campaign "STEMGives", PTO money supports various need of student and teachers;
