Common App 101

Registering for a Common App Account

- Go to www.commonapp.org
- Select 'Create an Account' in the upper right corner
- You will create a 'First Time Student' account
 - o Use your full legal name
 - Use an appropriate email address that you check often. I suggest using a personal email address over your STEM email address
 - You are planning to start college in Fall 2024
 - Determine if you want schools to receive your information and if Common App may communicate with you
 - o Agree to the Common App terms and click 'Create'


Your Dashboard Options

• My Colleges Tab

- This tab will allow you to continue your application for each college
- This is also where you will complete college specific questions, supplementals, invite and manage recommenders, and submit your applications to each college

• Common App Tab

- This tab has the information that is sent to every university you submit an application to
- As sections are completed, you will receive a green check mark



• College Search Tab

 Where you will search for colleges and add them to you 'My Colleges' tab

• Financial Aid Resources Tab

 This tab has resources for you to glance over in regards to the financial aspect of attending college

Common App Tab 'Profile' Tips

• Common App Fee Waiver

- You only qualify for an Application Fee Waiver if one of the following is true:
 - You have received or are eligible to receive an ACT/SAT fee waiver.
 - You are enrolled in or eligible to participate in the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch program (FRPL).
 - Your annual family income falls within the Income Eligibility Guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service.
 - You are enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., TRIO programs such as Upward Bound).
 - Your family receives public assistance. You live in a federally subsidized public housing, a foster home or are homeless.
 - You are a ward of the state or an orphan.

Common App Tab 'Education' Tips

Current or Most Recent Secondary/High School

- Search for STEM School Highlands Ranch in the database and select
- Entry Date: August 2020 (unless you transferred to STEM or are graduating early)
- Select NO for boarding school
- Graduation Date: May 2024

Other Secondary/High Schools

- If you attended a different high school during your high school career, select the number you attended
- o If you only attended STEM, select zero

Colleges and Universities

• If you have taken a college course during 9-12th grade (concurrent enrollment included) select the number of colleges attended

Common App Tab 'Education' Tips Continued

Grades

- *Graduating class size: 115
- Class rank reporting: Quartile
- o GPA scale: 4 point scale
- o Cumulative GPA: List your GPA after junior year is completed
- o GPA weighting: Weighted

Current or Most Recent Year Courses

- o STEM is on a semester system
- Enter every course you are taking senior year
- Course Levels: Choose regular, Advanced Placement (AP), or Dual Enrollment

Honors

o List up to 5 honors you have received beginning with 9th grade

• Community Based Organizations

• Indicate the number of community programs or organizations that have provided you with free assistance in your application process. Only answer this question if it applies.

Future Plans

• Indicate your career interest and the highest degree you intend to pursue. These are just ideas of your plans, not anything set in stone!


Common App Tab 'Testing' and 'Activities' Tips

Testing

- Some schools are still test optional, so it is up to you if you self report your scores for SAT or ACT
- o For AP subject tests, always report any tests you scored a 4 or 5


Activities

- You are able to list up to 10 activities
- o List the activities in order of importance *to you*
- Indicate the number of hours per week and weeks per year you dedicate to each activity
- If you intend to continue to participate in the activity for your senior year, make sure you check the 12th grade box
- If you select that you do want to continue a similar activity in college, it is not binding you to anything. You can always change your mind!





The 'My Colleges' Tab




When you click into specific colleges under the 'My Colleges' tab, you will be able to see application deadlines, other deadline information, application fees, testing policy, required recommendation letters, writing requirements, and college questions.

Click on the above image to view a screen recording of the My Colleges section of Common App




Click on the above image to view a screen recording of the Questions section on Common App



- 1. When you select Recommenders and FERPA, you will need to first sign your FERPA release. Click view details to have picture #2 open.
- You will need to read the release and agree before you are able to have recommenders added. You have the option of waiving your right to review the recommendation and I highly suggest doing this. Recommenders might not write a letter for you if you have not waived the right to view. Colleges sometimes see it as suspicious as well. Once you "sign" and date, you will be rerouted to picture #3.
- 3. Now you will need to invite your counselor and teachers for letters. Start with counselor. Click on "invite counselor".
- 4. Picture #4 shows what information you need from your counselor. Every student will enter my information (Kelli Myrick, kelli.myrick@stemk12.org). If you would like your counselor letter of recommendation to come from Ms. Birchfield or Mr. Link you will still put in my information.


 Link/Birchfield will send their letters to me and I will upload on their behalf. Putting my information allows transcripts to be sent to universities easier:) I always suggest choosing the counselor that knows you best as it will make for a more personalized letter, so feel free to ask whichever of the 3 of us you would like!




- 5. Now you will select "invite teacher" and complete the same process.
- 6. Once you have invited a teacher, you will need to assign them to *each* university that you would like their letter sent. Repeat this step for each school you want their letter sent to.
- 7. Some universities also allow "other" recommenders to send letters. Should your university allow this, picture number 7 will appear below the counselor and teacher section. You will add their information.
- 8. Assign the "other" recommender to schools like you did with teachers.

Common App Tab 'Writing Supplement' Tips

- Not all schools will have additional supplementals. Should an application have addition questions or essays needed, the 'Writing Supplement' section will appear under the 'Review and Submit - Common App' section.
