oject updates	Dr. Karen Johnson, Elementary School Principal	CMAS Growth Report (did not include 3 <sup>rd</sup> graders): Goal of CO is at least 50% growth. Legend: Yellow or Gold are goals that haven't been met. Missing data means that there wasn't enough in that population/growth to be statistically significant. CDE reviews each school.  PARCC scores/PSAT scores − Overall for 3 <sup>rd</sup> , 4 <sup>th</sup> & 5 <sup>th</sup> − STEM was higher than district and state. Same for 6 <sup>th</sup> , 7 <sup>th</sup> & 8 <sup>th</sup> grade except for Math for 7 <sup>th</sup> grade □ looking into root cause. Question: What %tage have opted out? 90% of our students took the test. Think that State needs school at 95%. HS: Did similarly well across ELA, Math and Science − higher than district and state.  PSAT & SAT − STEM scored higher than CO average for both  UIP goals/targets/action plans − STEM's goals included:  1. Improve the Academic Achievement and Growth of our students with disabilities and minority students will be our priority improvement challenge.  2. Lower Graduation rate − graduation rate for the class of 2015 was 79%. This had a negative impact on the Pots Secondary Workforce Readiness expectations.
